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UFI Global Congress in Cologne: Hotspot for the future of the trade fair industry

Largest annual meeting of the event business makes it Confex debut. New visitor record: around 550 industry experts from around the world. Trade fair industry secures more than 3.4 million jobs worldwide.

The 91st UFI Global Congress will bring the international trade fair industry together from 20 to 23 November 2024 in Koelnmesse's Confex. For four days, the industry's leading minds will be discussing current challenges facing the trade fair industry at the Global Congress of the UFI, The Global Association of the Exhibition Industry setting the course for the future of the global event and networking business. "The motto of this year's congress 'Changes to Chances' could hardly be more apt. It emphasises how profoundly changes and opportunities are connected and how crucial it is to approach both with an open mind," said Gerald Böse, CEO of host Koelnmesse GmbH, at today's opening press conference.

Trade fair companies around the world have made a strong comeback since the global coronavirus pandemic came to an end. UFI is forecasting record sales for 2024 and further growth of 17 percent on average compared to the previous year for the global exhibition industry. An analysis by UFI and consulting firm Oxford Economics found that trade fair participants generated global business sales totalling over 299 billion euros (335 billion US dollars). According to the study, the industry directly and indirectly secures some 3.4 million jobs worldwide.

At the same time, the trade fair industry is experiencing some profound technological and cultural shifts, which are fundamentally changing requirements. "These developments offer opportunities to make events more inclusive, accessible and efficient, but also require the development of new skills," says Geoff Dickinson, president of UFI. "The opportunity to develop strategies together, especially in intense times, to transform the changes of today into the opportunities of tomorrow is unique," adds Kai Hattendorf, CEO of UFI.

Trade fairs and congresses as drivers of a sustainable economy

With a new record of around 550 participants from over 55 markets and regions and a diverse programme featuring some 50 speakers, the 91st UFI Global Congress in Cologne is raising the bar. Speakers include leading names from the trade fair industry and external experts from such renowned organisations as the Economist Intelligence Unit, The Guardian and Gapminder.

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"Networking events like this are platforms for people from different cultures and countries to engage in dialogue and work on solutions together," says Jörn Holtmeier, Managing Director of the Association of the German Trade Fair Industry, AUMA. "At the same time, trade fairs make a contribution to climate protection, by efficiently pooling face-to-face meetings and helping to prevent individual journeys." A recent study by the association found that, per trade fair day, trade fair visitors avoid an average of five additional business trips by pooling their meetings at the trade fair. International visitors save as many as eight journeys per trade fair day on average.

Change is on the agenda in Cologne

"Koelnmesse is the ideal venue for the UFI Global Congress, especially in its centennial year," said Gerald Böse on the opening day. "Permanent change is deeply rooted in our history, from the first classic trade fairs in 1924 to state-of-the-art digital formats and this new location, Confex, which offers a one-of-a-kind blend of conference and exhibition hall." Böse added: "I am looking forward to the new ideas and insights that this congress will offer in all areas - including the topic of sustainability. At Koelnmesse, we are consistently pursuing the goal of climate neutrality by 2030 and are focusing on innovative solutions to achieve this."

In its 100th anniversary year, Koelnmesse announced a historic sales record and a profit of 42 million euros. Overall, Cologne's trade fair activities contribute a total of 2.0 billion euros to the German economy each year, 1.1 billion euros of which is generated directly in Cologne. They secure around 18,500 jobs, including 12,000 in Cologne. Koelnmesse is further expanding its global presence through its latest international expansions, particularly in Asia, Latin America and the Middle East.
